First Year General Education (GE) Advising

It is recommended that you complete your First Year General Education Advising Module before you register for Fall. If you have not yet completed this step, you can access the <u>First Year GE Advising Module instructions</u>.

You should plan to complete the GE Advising Module before you attend Orientation or register for your first semester.

Mathematics and English Placements

You will receive an email to your CSUF student email from the Business Advising Center prior to your registration date. In that email, you will be informed of how to find your English (GE Area A.2) and Mathematics (GE Area B.4) placements and a guideline of what math and English course you should register for in fall. You can expect this email from businessadvising@fullerton.edu. These are important courses that you need to prioritize for the fall semester.

ALEKS Information

If applicable, Business Administration and Economics majors can complete the ALEKS Assessment for calculus readiness. International Business students are not required to complete the ALEKS modules. If you received an email regarding the ALEKS assessment, you should complete it to determine which math course you can register for in your first semester. You must start ALEKS at least a week before registration and complete it at least 48 business hours before registering. **Fall registration begins June 26, 2023.**

You may access the ALEKS Modules by searching for "ALEKS" in your CSUF Student Portal.



Register for Your First Semester

Registration begins June 26, 2023, do not wait until orientation to register.

Use this pre-made roadmap for registration. *Again, once registration opens be sure you register, to the best of your ability*. When you attend Orientation, you and an advisor will review your class schedule together. If any adjustments are needed, you will work with the advisor to make those adjustments to your semester schedule during orientation.

Course Selection Tips

Read these tips and reminders before you utilize these roadmaps to create your first semester schedule:

- Find your Mathematics and English Placement information first. Refer to **page 4** of this packet for more information.
- Ideally, you should register for **GE Area A.2 (ENGL 101)** <u>OR</u> **GE Area A.1 in your first semester.** You are <u>not</u> able to register for both GE Area A.2 (ENGL 101) <u>AND</u> GE Area A.1 in your first semester.
- Ideally, you should register for a **Math course in your first semester.** See the Mathematics Placement information on **page 4**.
- You must take GE Area A.1 (Oral Communication), GE Area A.2 (Written Communication), and GE Area B.4 (Mathematics) before the start of year 2.
- 12-15 units in the fall semester is considered full-time for incoming freshmen. You are encouraged to register for a minimum of 12 units in fall.
- If courses in your first semester roadmap are full when you are registering for fall courses, you may instead look in the following GE Areas for additional course options for fall. You can refer to your Titan Degree Audit (TDA) for your list of course options in these GE Areas:

Transfer Coursework and Advanced Placement (AP) Information

Transfer Coursework from a Community College

If you have taken any college-level coursework before starting at CSUF, make sure you have submitted an official transcript from each community college attended to CSUF Office of Admissions so your transfer courses can be added to your Titan Degree Audit (TDA). For now, avoid registering for courses that seem similar to anything you've completed at the community college.

You can see instructions of where to send an official transcript to CSUF's Admissions and Records on their <u>website</u>.

AP and IB Credit

If you have taken any AP or IB exams, make sure you have submitted your AP scores electronically from www.collegeboard.org to CSUF Office of Admissions in order for your Titan Degree Audit (TDA) to be updated.

If you know your final scores, refer to the charts from **page 10-12** to see which area(s) of General Education they will fulfill and avoid registering for any requirements that will already be completed. **For reference, your catalog year is <u>Fall 2023</u>**.

Registration Checklist

Registering for your first semester's courses can be both exciting and stressful. As a college student, you now have autonomy when it comes to your class choices and scheduling.

You are able to begin registering on June 26, 2023, but we recommend for you to start preparing your schedule **now** by following the steps below:

1. Go to Student Homepage and Find Your Enrollment Date & Time

Viewing Enrollment Appointments

2. Review Current Holds and To-Do List

You must review all your holds in detail before you begin registering for classes. Some holds are informational like your Math and Written/Comm holds and others may prohibit you from registering for courses.

Student Homepage and Holds Tutorial

3. Learn How to Register for Classes

Review all the tutorials on how to add, drop, and swap into courses. Note that you will have until the second week of classes to drop a course. Remember! It may be more helpful to SWAP a course instead of DROP.




4. Access and Review Your Titan Degree Audit (TDA)

Your TDA is an incredibly important tool to help you track your overall progress toward graduation. Your TDA will show you all required graduation requirements including General Education (GE), major, and other university unit and GPA requirements.

Your TDA is a living document and will be updated as you complete requirements and earn grades. We've included steps to access your current TDA below. You will want to follow these steps each time you wish to view your current TDA:



Registration Tips

Helpful Vocabulary

Course: the name of a class ex: HIST 110A

Section: the day and time of the course. There are multiple sections of each course.

Ex: HIST 110A M/W Mo/We 8:30AM- 9:45AM with Professor Chrissanthos

Some *sections* of courses are restricted for certain students. Be sure to check the Enrollment Requirements note when you add a course.



This section of HIST 110A is only for History majors, so you will receive an error message if you tried to enroll.

This section of HIST 110A does not have any Enrollment Requirements, so it is open to all students.

Seminar: A seminar is a smaller class where you are expected to discuss the content you have been assigned to learn for the week.

Lecture: A lecture is a larger class where the professor is the central discussant.

Waitlisting Guidelines

Waitlisting for a course is not a recommended strategy as it is not guaranteed you will get a spot in the class. However, if you find you need to waitlist for a course, you can choose the option during the enrollment process. The online waitlist feature will cease to function with the end of the first week of classes. Make sure the day and time of the waitlisted course is open in your schedule.

- 1. Students may waitlist up to two courses (up to 8 units).
- 2. Students can waitlist for a maximum of one section of the same course.
- 3. If students are already enrolled in a class and prefer to enroll in a different section in the same class, they must first drop the class they're enrolled in to be eligible to be waitlisted in another section of the same class.

Frequently Asked Questions (FAQ)

Category: Registration and Course Selection

When should I register for courses?

You can begin to register for your courses **on June 26, 2022**. Please refer to your Student Homepage to determine the exact time you can register.

I have questions about my Fall 2023 schedule after reading this packet, when will someone be able to answer my questions?

During your Orientation, your schedule will be reviewed by a business advisor, and you can make any suggested changes at that time.

Do all holds in my CSUF Student Center need to be removed before I can register for fall 2022 courses?

Some holds provide information and will not prevent you from registering for the fall semester. "Written Comm Placement Category" and "Math/QR Placement Category" do not need to be removed before you can register for courses.

Are there any classes I need to take in my first semester at CSUF?

All first-year students must take GE Area A.1 (Oral Communication), GE Area A.2 (Written Communication) and GE Area B.4 (Mathematics) before start of year 2. For Fall, you will ideally register for ENGL 101 (GE Area A.2) and your Mathematics placement course (GE Area B.4).

Refer to **page 4** for your information regarding your Mathematics and English placements and **page 6** for your first year academic roadmap.

I took courses at a local community college. What should I register for in fall? And when will my Titan Degree Audit (TDA) be updated to show this community college coursework?

Please make sure all official transcripts from every community college attended are submitted to CSUF's Office of Admissions for your TDA to be updated. To request your official transcript, visit your community college's website. You can see instructions of where to send an official transcript to <u>CSUF's Office of Admissions</u>.

When registering for fall, avoid registering for any courses that sound familiar to your community college coursework.

I haven't completed the ALEKS modules yet. What Math should I register for? If applicable, Business Administration and Economics majors should complete the ALEKS modules. International Business majors are not required to complete the ALEKS modules.

You will receive an email to your CSUF student email from the Business Advising Center prior to your registration date. In that email, you will be informed of how to find your English (GE Area A.2) and Mathematics (GE Area B.4) placements and a guideline of what math and English course you should register for in fall. You can expect this email from businessadvising@fullerton.edu.

After you complete the ALEKS module (Business Administration and Economics majors only), you will be notified via email if you need to register for a new Math course for fall. You will then be able to make that change and swap out Math courses if necessary.

I took AP courses. What should I register for in Fall? And when will my Titan Degree Audit (TDA) be updated to show my AP scores?

Advanced Placement (AP) credit, with specific scores, can be used to satisfy general education requirements. If you have taken any AP or IB exams, make sure you have submitted your AP scores electronically from www.collegeboard.org to CSUF Office of Admissions in order for your Titan Degree Audit (TDA) to be updated.

You may refer to **page 10** for more information regarding AP coursework. If you know your scores, refer to the chart provided to see which area(s) of General Education they will fulfill and avoid registering for any requirements that will already be completed.

Are all courses for Fall at CSUF going to be delivered on-campus? Will there be any virtual options available?

The majority of courses this Fall semester are going to be delivered on-campus. However, there will also be some online and hybrid course options as well.

Each instructor and department will decide how their courses will be delivered. So, when searching for courses, make sure to pay attention to the "Days and Times" and "Room" portions of the course section you are considering so you may plan accordingly. Some more details on course delivery are listed below:

In-Person Courses: The courses will list a physical campus location under "Room". This means students will have all class meetings on campus.

Mostly In-Person (Hybrid): These courses will list "Hybrid Instruction" and a physical campus location under "Room". This means students will have a combination of inperson and online activities.

Fully Online: These courses do not require in-person meetings. Courses may include synchronous and asynchronous online meetings/activities. Be sure to read the course schedule carefully.

- Synchronous instruction will only meet online during the specified times under "Days & Times". The instructor and student engage in activities at the same time. This means students will need to attend Zoom class meetings each week.
- Asynchronous instruction does not require you to be present at a specific time. The instructor and students engage in activities that are not necessarily occurring simultaneously.

If you have any additional questions regarding how a course will be delivered after reading the course section details, we recommend for you to reach out to the instructor directly. Their information will be listed in the course details.

When do I pay for my courses after I register for Fall?

You may refer to the <u>Student Business Services</u> website for important payment dates and **deadlines for Fall 2023**.

The one-year roadmaps on page 6 to 9 are really helpful. Do you have roadmaps available beyond the first year?

Yes. If you would like to plan ahead, you can find requirement sheets and roadmaps for each concentration option on our major. You can find these on <u>our website</u>. Click on "Major Requirements and Roadmaps" and then your major of choice. You will then select the requirement sheet and roadmap for your Fall 2023 catalog year and intended concentration. The Economics major does not have concentration options.

I am currently a business student, but I want to change my major. How can I do that?

To change your major, you will need to reach out to your desired major's advising staff who will guide you through the process. Until you can connect with them, we would recommend for you to register for your Fall semester based on the roadmap and directions in this packet. Your new department advising staff can then make any suggested changes.

Category: COVID-19
