Before selecting course for a general management concentration:

1. Identify 3-5 courses best aligned with you specific career goals (BEFORE) faculty meeting.
2. Meet with a faculty mentor designated by the department to approve your course selection.

Please keep in mind:

1. No more than one 300 level elective course is acceptable. The other two of the three electives must be 400 level courses.
2. Students must complete the pre-requisite course(s) of each chosen elective at least a semester before registering for the chosen elective course.
3. The 400 level courses of the E&HM and Entrepreneurship concentrations are impacted. Thus, the students of those impacted concentrations that are graduating in the current registering semester will have priority.
