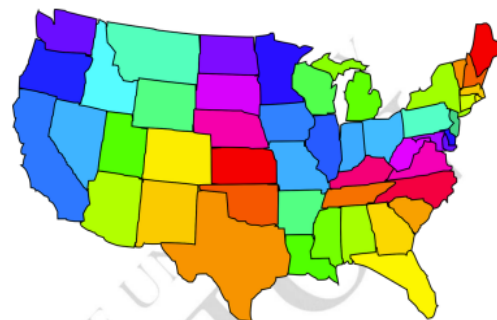


Management - Supply Chain Management
